Fourth of July Celebration at Stonegate North Villages Pool

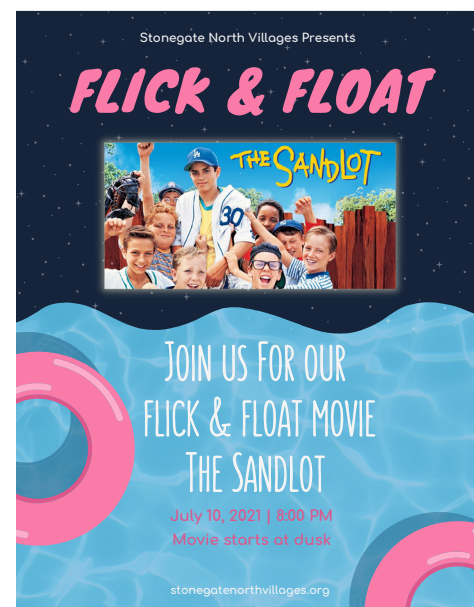
The Stonegate North Villages Pool will host music and games throughout the day on the 4th of July. Please check the website and look for flyers at the pool with more information and a schedule of activities.

Mobile Access Passes – Vetted Residents Only as of July 7th

More than 1,500 applications for Mobile Access Passes have been processed as of mid-June. Currently, residents are still provided access to the facilities provided they have initiated the process, by applying for a Mobile Access Pass.

It is important to note that as of Wednesday, July 7th at 10 a.m. the district will only be allowing in residents who have been vetted and approved.

All residents over the age of 18 will require a Mobile Access Pass to enter the pool. The current protocol allows for residents who have applied, but not yet downloaded the Mobile Access Pass or been fully vetted to be allowed in to the facilities, provided they have initiated the process. But this will change. If you have not yet initiated the process, please ensure you do so, and if your approval has not been authorized, please ensure you follow up or provide the necessary proof of residency. If you have applied but have not seen an approval, please check your spam folder as a first step. Many residents have written in to say they have not seen their approval, only to discover that approval was directed to their spam folder. If you have an email stating the district has been unable to verify your residency, please ensure you provide appropriate proof of residency or have submitted the necessary form from your landlord. We are very happy that this process has eliminated people who have been accessing the pool, without appropriate usage rights — and while it is a large process to undertake, it has been critical to ensuring facilities usage is granted to Stonegate North Villages and Stonegate Village residents only.
