Update on Tree Program

Approximately 25 new trees are being planted as a result of the district's collaborative tree-planting initiative.

The district's management company, PCMS, has now contacted all of the residents who formally requested additional trees be planted adjacent open space to their property.

With the initiative, homeowners in Stonegate North Villages qualify to request additional trees, selecting from a district-approved list of tree types that will work well in the area. Homeowners are required to pay for the planting of the trees from the approved list, but the landscape contractor will provide a warranty for the trees and the district will maintain the ongoing landscape enhancement.

While this year's program has concluded, we hope to offer it again in the future. Thank you to those who participated this year!



Meet Your Board Member: Holly Kamm

It can be a bit hard to ground board member Holly Kamm.
